How to Use this Book

We are so excited that you're starting your journey through the book of Mark with us! You may have gotten this journal because living in the Word daily is difficult for you. Or, maybe this discipline comes naturally for you, but you simply want to take a different approach in your study of scripture. Regardless of where you may fall in this aspect of your walk with God, our prayer is that you would see scripture in an entirely new way in the next few weeks.

The goal of this journal is simple: we want it to be a tool for you. Each weekday, there will be a short reading out of the book of Mark. We recommend that you start your time with prayer, then slowly read through that day's passage. You may even want to read it multiple times; something new could stand out with each read! Write down what stands out to you in the lines. After completing the reading, finish out with that day's reflection questions and pray about what you took away from your time in the Word.

Weekends look a little different in this journal. On Saturdays, you will find a short devotional and guided prayer that covers a takeaway from what you read that week. On Sundays, we encourage you to use the blank notes page to take sermon notes at church.

We hope your time in the book of Mark is reflective, fruitful, and eyeopening for you!

Overview

The Gospel of Mark is considered by some as the most important of the "synoptic" gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John), mainly because it was the earliest written. With brevity and urgency, John Mark describes the birth, life, work, and teachings of Jesus Christ. Highlighted with action and vivid storytelling, this Gospel underscores the transformative power of faith and encourages us to remain steadfast in our commitment to Christ, even in the midst of trials and uncertainties. The Gospel of Mark stands not only as a historical account of Jesus' life, but also as a source of inspiration and guidance for the early Christian community navigating the challenges of their time.

Locations

The Gospel of Mark takes us on a journey through various locations significant to the life and ministry of Jesus. From the bustling streets of Capernaum, where Jesus performed many miracles, to the tranquil shores of the Sea of Galilee, where He taught the crowds from a boat, each location carries profound symbolic and spiritual significance. Jerusalem plays a central role in Mark's account, serving as the backdrop for Jesus' final days, the Last Supper, and ultimately, His crucifixion and resurrection.

PLACES: Capernaum, Nazareth, Caesarea Philippi, Jericho, Bethany, Mount of Olives, Jerusalem, Golgotha

Author's Bio

Although he wasn't one of Jesus' twelve Disciples, John Mark was a figure mentioned in the New Testament who grew up in the middle of the early church. In fact, his mother Mary's home was an epicenter for the early church, as referenced in Acts 12, and perhaps the location of the Last Supper. His uncle Barnabas was Paul's right-hand man, and he was extremely close to the Apostle Peter, so close that Peter referred to him as "my son" in 1 Peter 5:13. It is likely that John Mark wrote this gospel from the firsthand accounts of Peter's sermons.





Listen to the Right Voice

READING:

Mark 1:1-20

VERSE OF THE DAY:

And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

Mark 1:11

REFLECTION:

- So many voices compete for our attention.
- So many sources want to tell you who you are.
- So many opinions exist about you, your life, and your purpose.
- Only one voice speaks from Heaven's throne.
- If the voice you're hearing is not calling you "beloved," it's not God's voice.
- God says, "You are mine and I love you."

Move Away from Distractions

READING:

Mark 1:21-45

VERSE OF THE DAY:

Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed.

Mark 1:35

- Jesus got up early to beat the morning noise.
- · Jesus went away from activity.
- Jesus isolated Himself temporarily.
- Jesus went to an empty place to FILL UP.
- Jesus went to a lonely place to BE WITH GOD.
- Jesus went to a lifeless place to LIVE FULLY.

READING:

Mark 2:1-17

VERSE OF THE DAY:

While Jesus was having dinner at Levi's house, many tax collectors and sinners were eating with him and his disciples, for there were many who followed him. Mark 2:15

- Those who society had written off were welcomed at Jesus' house.
- Those who followed Jesus mingled with the lost.
- Everyone enjoyed being around Jesus, except the uptight, religious people.
- Jesus didn't care about public perception.
- Jesus cared about reaching people in need.

READING:

Mark 2:18-28

VERSE OF THE DAY:

- · Sabbath is about 3 things:
 - 1. STOPPING calling a timeout to pause what you're doing
 - 2. OBSERVING reflecting on what is behind and before you
 - 3. CELEBRATING expressing gratitude and joy
- · A rhythm of rest is restoring.
- · You must do ALL 3 or you will burn out.

The Gospel is Attractive

READING:

Mark 3:1-19

VERSE OF THE DAY:

Jesus withdrew with his disciples to the lake, and a large crowd from Galilee followed. When they heard about all he was doing, many people came to him from Judea, Jerusalem, Idumea, and the regions across the Jordan and around Tyre and Sidon.

Mark 3:7-8

- Over the course of history, there have been seasons where people have been inexplicably drawn in from the corners of the earth to be with Jesus.
- We sometimes call this "Revival."
- The good news draws people in.
- The message of Jesus is contagious.
- It's hard to stay away.

A Focus on Prayer

SCRIPTURE:

Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. Simon and his companions went to look for him, and when they found him, they exclaimed: "Everyone is looking for you!" Jesus replied, "Let us go somewhere else—to the nearby villages—so I can preach there also. That is why I have come. So he traveled throughout Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons.

Mark 1:35-39

PRAYER DIRECTION:

Jesus prioritized His time alone with the Father. In this passage of scripture, we see that after His intentional prayer time with the Father, He then had clear direction. Immediately after His time of prayer, He told the disciples exactly where they needed to go next. His time of prayer was not only a time to talk with the Father, but also to receive from Him. When we get alone with God in prayer, the same can happen for us. Is there any area of your life where you need direction from God? Bring that to Him faithfully in prayer.

PRAYER FOR GUIDANCE:

Thank You, God, that You are sovereign over every area of my life. Thank You that I am able to approach You in prayer and seek Your supernatural wisdom and guidance! There is no one more wise than You. Please give me wisdom and direction in ___ (express your specific needs to God here). Thank You for Your help in all things! I am dependent on You, and I am trusting in You.

Division Leads to Disaster

READING:

Mark 3:20-35

VERSE OF THE DAY:

"If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand." Mark 3:25

- Healthy houses have unity.
- · Division is a disease.
- To be STEADY, have UNITY.
- UNITY is a COMMON VISION and PURPOSE.
- DIVISION is a result of competing AGENDAS.
- UNITY happens when we move together in the same direction and for the same reason.

READING:

Mark 4:1-20

- · Be fertile soil, receptive and willing to grow.
- This starts with listening.
- · Be open to the Word in both your heart and mind.
- Accept the authority of God's Word.
- · Our lives should produce fruit.
- The fruit of your life is the evidence of what God has done and is doing.
- What we hear and receive changes who we are.

READING:

- · Shine your light at home.

Understanding Diminishes Fear

READING:

Mark 4:35-41

VERSE OF THE DAY:

They were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"

Mark 4:41

- They followed Jesus but didn't understand Him fully yet.
- · Miracles wowed them.
- · His true nature eluded them.
- Even in His presence, they were mystified.
- None of them fully understood until AFTER His death and resurrection.

Who is Jesus to you?
How would you respond to a storm being calmed?
When did you first encounter Jesus?
How did the resurrection change things for you?





Do We Want the Results?

READING:

Mark 5:1-20

VERSE OF THE DAY:

Those who had seen it told the people what had happened to the demonpossessed man—and told about the pigs as well. Then the people began to plead with Jesus to leave their region.

Mark 5:16-17

- It was a great day for the man with demons.
- It was a bad day for the pig farmer.
- Helping one person doesn't always equate to hurting someone else.
- Do we want the MIRACLE but not the results?
- Life with Jesus means accepting EVERYTHING.
- · We don't get to pick and choose.

A Focus on Prayer

SCRIPTURE:

And he said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable shall we use for it? It is like a grain of mustard seed, which, when sown on the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth, yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes larger than all the garden plants and puts out large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

Mark 4:30-32 ESV

PRAYER DIRECTION:

The smallest seed is used to explain the importance of sowing even the smallest things in faith. What the Lord does with the small supercedes our limits and produces solutions for more than just ourselves, but for others. The mustard seed provided branches for birds to nest and have shade. Our faith, as small as a mustard seed, when sown in good soil, covers more than we could ever ask, think, or imagine. Something small, with faith, can carry immense significance.

PRAYER OF PERSPECTIVE:

Lord, forgive me for allowing my judgment of small beginnings to limit my faith in how big You are! I pray that what You have shown me to sow, even if it's so small, will benefit Your Kingdom. Thank You for reminding me it is not about me, but about You. I pray that You receive all the glory, and that my faith would rise in seeing all You do with one small step of obedience. I love You, Lord! May Your kingdom come and Your will be done. In Jesus' name, Amen.

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Be Humble Before Jesus

READING:

Mark 5:21-43

VERSE OF THE DAY:

Then one of the synagogue leaders, named Jairus, came, and when he saw Jesus, he fell at his feet.

Mark 5:22

- Look for opportunities to encounter Jesus.
- Take your needs to Jesus.
- Approach Jesus with HUMILITY.
- Jairus went to Jesus, submitting to a greater authority than his own.
- · Jesus was moved by this father to help him.

You Will Always Have Doubters

READING:

Mark 6:1-29

VERSE OF THE DAY:

Mark 6:2

- Some will question WHY you have been blessed, given leadership, saved, or given a platform.
- · Some will question your skill, integrity, and ability.
- Some will question what you do.
- Some will question how you do it.
- Some will question if you are the right one.
- Don't fall for IMPOSTER SYNDROME.
- Believe in the opportunities God has given you.

- · Don't let the seeds of corruption hang around.
- ONE ACTION DOES NOT DEFINE YOU.
- But everyday choices declare who you are.
- Don't be a slave to bad choices.

READING:

Mark 7:24-37

- When you experience what Jesus does, you can't be silent about it.

A Focus on Prayer

SCRIPTURE:

While Jesus was still speaking, some people came from the house of Jairus, the synagogue leader. "Your daughter is dead," they said. "Why bother the teacher anymore?" Overhearing what they said, Jesus told him, "Don't be afraid; just believe."

Mark 5:35-36

PRAYER DIRECTION:

Jairus (who was like a local pastor) sought Jesus when he was desperate to see his daughter healed. After she died, people considered the situation beyond Jesus' ability and thought that Jairus' continuing with his request was a waste of Jesus' time. But Jesus had a very different perspective. Jesus heard Jairus' plea, and His intention to heal had not changed—even with the delay, and even in the face of death! Jesus was as able to raise the dead as He was to heal the sick. Our requests move His heart to action if we will ignore doubt and persist in faith, even if it seems beyond hope! What is this situation for you?

PRAYER OF FAITH:

Heavenly Father, thank You that You are good and Your mercy endures forever! Thank You for blessing my life with many good things, and most of all, for a relationship with You through Jesus' blood. I remember many times that You intervened and provided for me in my need—thank You for Your faithfulness! Today, I bring ____ to You. It feels too big and beyond hope in human terms, but that which is impossible for me is possible for You! Strengthen my faith to see what You see, and speak what You say no matter what it looks like. I give You this area and ask for Your mighty hand to move and bring hope, healing, and restoration for Your glory! In Jesus' name, Amen.

Jesus Cares

READING:

Mark 8:1-21

VERSE OF THE DAY:

During those days another large crowd gathered. Since they had nothing to eat, Jesus called his disciples to him and said, "I have compassion for these people; they have already been with me three days and have nothing to eat. If I send them home hungry, they will collapse on the way, because some of them have come a long distance."

Mark 8:1-3

REFLECTION:

In the business of everything that was going on, it was JESUS who took note of the needs of others. He didn't delegate His compassion to a team. HE noticed. HE cared. HE took action.

What does compassion look like to you!
Have you been too busy to see the needs of others?
What is something you can do today to show someone else that you see them and that you care?

READING:

Mark 8:22-30

VERSE OF THE DAY:

READING:

Mark 9:2-13

VERSE OF THE DAY:

Then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!"

- Peter, James, and John experienced the miraculous!
- The glory of God showed up, and God told them to listen to Jesus.
- · Jesus is worth listening to!
- God doesn't speak to PERFECT people.
- He speaks to people CLOSE to Him.

A Focus on Prayer

SCRIPTURE:

"But if you can do anything, have compassion on us and help us." And Jesus said to him, "If you can'? All things are possible for one who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I do believe; help my unbelief!"

Mark 9:22b-24

PRAYER DIRECTION:

We can learn so much from this father's response! When he lacked faith, he asked Jesus Himself to help him with that. We will all face hard things in life that may deter our faith and bring up hard questions. If you are currently experiencing this, be encouraged by this story and know that God can handle all of your hesitations and questions. He wants us to bring them directly to Him. Sometimes the only expression of faith we can muster is simply coming to Jesus. As we see in this story, our coming to Him and asking for His help is always enough. He is faithful to meet us there.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION:

Thank You, Lord, that Your grace is sufficient and Your power is made perfect in my weakness. I desire to trust You in every area of my life. If there is any part of my life that I do not have full faith in You, please forgive me. And just as the father in Mark 9 prayed, I also pray here and now: I do believe; help my unbelief! Thank You for who You are. Grow my faith in You so that I may trust and follow You fully in all things!

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Work Reveals Intent

READING:

Mark 9:30-50

VERSE OF THE DAY:

"Do not stop him," Jesus said. "For no one who does a miracle in my name can in the next moment say anything bad about me."

Mark 9:39

REFLECTION:

- · Someone who works in their own name is building their own kingdom.
- Someone who works in Jesus' name is building THE Kingdom.
- Be someone intent on advancing THE Kingdom.

READING:

Mark 10:46-52

Mark 10:51-52

- The blind man had such faith that he called out to Jesus, confident that he would see, respond to, and heal him.
- The blind man had vision for his future. Vision for his healing. Vision for his restoration.
- When others couldn't see, he could!

A Focus on Prayer

SCRIPTURE:

As Jesus and his disciples, together with a large crowd, were leaving the city, a blind man, Bartimaeus, was sitting by the roadside begging. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Many rebuked him and told him to be quiet, but he shouted all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called to the blind man, "Cheer up! On your feet! He's calling you." Throwing his cloak aside, he jumped to his feet and came to Jesus. "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked him. The blind man said, "Rabboni, I want to see." "Go," said Jesus, "your faith has healed you." Immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus along the road. Mark 10:46b-52

PRAYER DIRECTION:

Bartimaeus was humble, persistent, and unashamed in his pursuit of Jesus. He was not deterred by many rebuking him, but he continued to cry out to God, even as they tried to quiet him. And when he did speak to Jesus directly, he called Him "Rabboni" (which means "my lord" or "my master") before expressing his need. This clearly displayed his faith in and submission to Christ. We can learn so much from this. Can this persistence, humility, and boldness be seen in your prayer life? Is there a need in your life that you need to faithfully recommit to Him in prayer? If Jesus were to ask you "What do you want me to do for you?" as He did Bartimaeus, how would you respond?

PRAYER OF BOLD PERSISTENCE:

Thank You, Jesus, that because of who You are and all that You've done, I can approach Your throne of grace with confidence and boldness. Thank You for being gracious, merciful, and kind. Forgive me for when I have not come to You with faith, humility, and persistence. Please help me in _____ (express your prayer needs to the Lord openly). Thank You for moving on my behalf. I surrender these needs in full faith and trust to You.

Obey the Instructions

READING:

Mark 11:1-11

VERSE OF THE DAY:

They answered as Jesus had told them to, and the people let them go. Mark 11:6

- Jesus sent them with a very specific goal.
- When they encountered opposition, they remembered their instructions.
- Their instructions kept them out of trouble.
- · You can't follow instructions you don't know.
- · You can't know if you don't listen.





Forgive First

READING:

Mark 11:12-25

VERSE OF THE DAY:

"And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive them, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins."

Mark 11:25

- It's hard to seek the Lord in prayer without first offering forgiveness.
- Don't let unresolved issues get between you and God.
- FORGIVE others. Deal with it.
- · God will deal graciously with you.
- Set an EXAMPLE of forgiveness.

Answer to Jesus

READING:

Mark 11:27-33

VERSE OF THE DAY:

- Jesus' authority superceded anything they could imagine.
- Jesus is the higher authority God's Son.
- Refusing Jesus is refusing the One who sent Him.
- Religious people want to play games.
- Jesus doesn't play games.

READING:

Mark 12:1-17

- Become familiar with it. Let it be like an old friend to you. Spend time together. Go there for daily instructions.
- KNOW God's Power.
- Be in His presence to experience His power. That might happen in prayer alone, but it also commonly happens in worship and prayer together.

A Focus on Prayer

SCRIPTURE:

"Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive them, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins."

Mark 11:24-25

PRAYER DIRECTION:

While teaching on effective prayer, Jesus encourages us to pray with great faith and a pure heart. When we hold unforgiveness in our hearts, it will hinder us from receiving the forgiveness God wants us to receive from Him. Is there anyone in your life you need to forgive? Forgiving others is a continual and lifelong journey for Christ followers. Continue to ask for God's help in forgiving those who have wronged you. This humble posture before God honors Him and allows Him to work in and through our lives.

PRAYER OF FORGIVENESS:

Thank You, Jesus, for how You have so freely forgiven me. Help me to not
forget all the ways I desperately need forgiveness, and to forgive freely
as You do. Thank You that Your love and grace not only flows to me but
through me. I need Your help in forgiving the people who have hurt me.
It is not within my human ability to forgive, but I know it is within Yours.
I know that because of what You've done, Your spirit lives in me.
So by the power of Your Spirit, I forgivefor
(talk openly with the Lord about who you need to forgive and how you have
been hurt). Because Your forgiveness is at work in my life, I forgive them
for these things, and release them to You.

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Nothing is More Important

READING:

Mark 12:28-34

VERSE OF THE DAY:

"The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

Mark 12:29-31

- · Let love lead the charge.
- · Begin with your love for God.
- Prove it by loving the people around you.

- If you're asleep, you'll miss the opportunity.

A Focus on Prayer

SCRIPTURE:

One of the teachers of the law came and heard them debating. Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked him, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?" "The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

Mark 12:28-31

PRAYER DIRECTION:

This teacher asked a genuine question that we may have all asked at one point: What is the most important command? Jesus answered simply yet profoundly, saying the first command is to know that God is the one true God and to love Him with every facet of our being—heart, soul, mind, and strength. The second one is to love your neighbor as yourself. The greatest command is not about the works we do to make ourselves worthy or holy, but it is about the posture of our hearts toward God and how we treat those around us.

PRAYER OF FIRST LOVE:

God, I pray that I am able to live out the greatest command every day. Help me to love You, the one true living God, with all my heart, soul, mind, and strength. Guide my thoughts, words, and actions so they reflect Your love. Teach me to love my neighbor as myself. Give me the grace to see others through Your eyes, and help me to be understanding and compassionate. Let the way that I love others be a reflection of how You love me.

READING:

Mark 14:1-11

VERSE OF THE DAY:

"Leave her alone," said Jesus. "Why are you bothering her? She has done a beautiful thing to me."

Mark 14:6

- Those who scolded had skewed priorities.
- Worship is NEVER wasted.
- Caring for the NEEDY matters.
- It flows OUT of your love for God.
- It can demonstrate devotion.

SACURDAY

A Focus on Prayer

SCRIPTURE:

"Abba, Father," he said, "everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will." Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. "Simon," he said to Peter, "are you asleep? Couldn't you keep watch for one hour? Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." Mark 14:36-38

PRAYER DIRECTION:

Jesus literally prayed to the Father what He would then ask Simon Peter (and consequently all of us) to observe. Surrender your flesh—your plan, your desires, your way—and value what is eternal over what is temporary. He never asks us to do something He Himself has not done. Jesus' surrender began with a confession of faith: "Everything is possible for you." The act of surrender begins with declaring God's ability—He then helps us rightly choose between what is temporary versus what is eternal. Our faith in Him makes it possible to fully surrender.

PRAYER:

Father, You are able! Thank you, Jesus, for Your complete surrender. I want to be like You. As an act of faith, Lord, I choose to say, "Not my will, but Yours." I hand to You what I desire. I want what You desire and ask You to help me choose what is significant for eternity over what is temporary. Holy Spirit, thank You for helping me and making the hard things easier. I love You, Lord Jesus, and thank You for Your surrender and eternal victory! Glory to You, King Jesus!

Who Do You Want Released?

READING:

Mark 15:1-15

VERSE OF THE DAY:

Wanting to satisfy the crowd, Pilate released Barabbas to them. He had Jesus flogged, and handed him over to be crucified.

Mark 15:15

- Everyone serves a king.
- The crowd chose Barabbas, the rebel, because they wanted to be their own king.
- · Pilate gave them what they wanted.
- · Who do we want in our lives?
- Do you want rebellion unleashed in your life?
- Do you want the King released in your life?
- The rebel chooses their own way.
- The King's Way is BETTER! ALWAYS.
- CHOOSE THE KING.

Mark 15:16-32

- Jesus was WILLING to DIE for them.

- Jesus' death destroyed the barrier.
- YOU now have full access to the presence and grace of God.

A Focus on Prayer

SCRIPTURE:

With a loud cry, Jesus breathed his last. The curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom.

Mark 15:37-38

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission.

Hebrews 5:7, ESV

PRAYER DIRECTION:

What were Jesus' final words before dying on the cross? The very last voice heard from Jesus' cross wasn't a word. It was a cry. In fact, it was described as a "loud cry," as He breathed His last. In Hebrews, we learn that Jesus often prayed to His Father with "loud cries." Jesus' final sound—as He expelled His last breath—was a loud heart-cry voiced to His Father. The King died in prayer. Wow! And at that moment, miles away in the temple, the curtain tore from top to bottom, opening the way for all of us to be cleansed of sin and now enter God's Holy presence in prayer. Jesus' prayers and death opened the door for us to be heard by His Father as our Father! Let us enter this precious door and pray our hearts out the way Jesus did!

PRAYER OF TRANSFORMATION:

Father, thank You for giving Your Son to forgive my sin so that I might become Your child! Lord Jesus, thank You for enduring so much pain and praying for me even as You breathed Your last. Transform my heart that I might pray and seek God as You did—with all my heart! Help me to become whole-hearted in my pursuit of Your presence and Your will. Please forgive me for when I have taken such a privilege for granted. The King of the Universe has made a way for us to draw near! May I always praise You for Your sacrifice, and may I enter the door You opened to Your Father in prayer every day.

So, brothers and sisters, we are completely free to enter the Most Holy Place without fear because of the blood of Jesus' death. We can enter through a new and living way that Jesus opened for us. It leads through the curtain—Christ's body. 21 And since we have a great priest over God's house, let us come near to God with a sincere heart and a sure faith" Hebrews 10:19-22
